-The golden rule of co-operatives means each member should be free to do what they want as long as it does not hurt or interfere with other members of the co-operative itself.

Members look out for each other, their children and the property in general. We try to build a harmonious community. That is what makes Aurora Village Co-op so strong.

HOW TO BECOME A MEMBER

If you are interested in becoming a member of our Co-op, you must attend an information session and submit a complete application form. This information will be reviewed by our Staff and passed on to the Membership Committee.

Membership will then contact you for an interview. After your interview takes place, interviewers will make a recommendation to the Membership Committee. The committee reviews and considers the recommendation and votes on submitting your application to the Board of Directors for approval.

Once approved, you will be notified by the Membership Committee and added to the external waiting lists.

SOME AURORA VILLAGE HISTORY

Built in 1982, Aurora Village Co-op consists of 62 apartments, 38 garden homes, and 22 townhouses. The apartments are located in the upper floors of a four and five-storey building which also contains the office, a meeting/recreation room, laundry room and other community facilities. The garden homes are two-storey units located on the ground level of the apartment building. The townhouses are located along the southern boundary of our property, thus forming a courtyard with the apartment building. There are one, two, three- and fourbedroom units.

OUR MISSION

To provide an open, voluntary membership within the context of affordable housing. To provide affordable housing based on service instead of profit. To provide leadership and growth equally so each member is empowered to grow and expand. Aurora village Co-op offers democratic management, security of tenure, and well-maintained homes in a beautiful setting. It is committed to fostering a co-operative community that is inclusive, safe and strong.

WHAT IS REQUIRED OF A MEMBER
